### A rocking roller



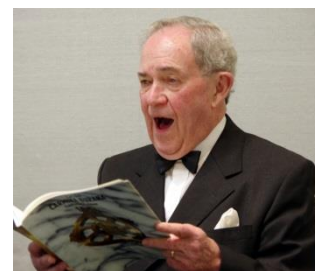
A recent (sometime last century) photo of one of CCR's talented popular afternoon presenters.
